

# **AIBA Selection Guidelines for the 2012 London Olympic Games Referees & Judges**

## **1. Introduction**

As the 1<sup>st</sup> Olympic Qualifying Event, the World Championships Baku 2011, is only 10 months away, it is AIBA's intention to announce the selection guidelines well in advance in order to conduct a fair and transparent selection process by providing equal chances and sufficient time for R&Js to meet all qualifications.

## **2. Total Number of Olympic R&Js**

There will be a total of 36 R&Js all from a different country including the host country.

## **3. Qualifications**

- A. Mandatory Requirements:
  - Must be a 3-Star R&J
  - No record of AIBA suspension/sanction
- B. Preference Points:
  - Good English Skills
  - Experience in WSB and Major AIBA Events
  - Long-term status as 3-Star R&J
  - Physical fitness and appearance

## **4. Evaluation Criteria**

- A. AIBA R&J Evaluation Status
- B. Performance in AIBA Major Events from 2011 – Final Selection (by AIBA R&J Evaluators)
- C. AIBA R&J Commission Recommendation

## **5. Selection Timetable**

- A. Phase I:
  - Select 70 3-Star R&Js for the World Championships Baku 2011 for a 1<sup>st</sup> screening process as follow:
    - AIBA will continue sending 2-Star and 3-Star R&Js for both World Junior/Youth Women Championships and World Junior Championships
    - In addition, AIBA will also select R&Js from existing R&J evaluation records

- B. Phase II:
- Select 50 R&Js from World Championships Baku 2011
  - Invite them for the AIBA Olympic R&J Workshop from November 19 – 23, 2011 in Cardiff, Wales
  - Appoint them for LOCOG Test Event to be held in the Olympic Venue on November 24 - 27, 2011 in London
- C. Phase III:
- Appoint all 50 R&Js for further Continental Olympic Qualifying Events from March – May 2012 for continue evaluation
- D. Phase IV:
- Final 36 R&Js will be selected in June 2012
  - AIBA will also select 2 reserved R&Js

## **6. Evaluation Principles**

- All evaluations will be conducted by AIBA R&J Commission
- R&J Commission's appointed R&J Evaluators will conduct the judges' evaluations in AIBA major events
- In addition, competition juries will also conduct referees' evaluations
- AIBA will conduct the selection independently in order to implement the process free of any political influence and outside pressure
